- In an area put loads of different items on the floor (make sure they are not sharp items). This will be the logs/tress that you would find in the woods. You must stroll through the wood like the mouse in

Snake Races:


- Have a think how a snake moves. Do they walk? Do

- If you win you get a point.
- Have as many races as you want.




Home Learning Activities - World Book Day - The **Gruffalo**

'The mouse found a nut and the nut was good':

- Use a ball or something small and round as a nut (it needs to be soft and can be thrown and caught).
- With a partner you are going to throw and catch the nut to eachother. (you can start by passing it over then progress to throwing and catching)
- Do it for 20 seconds.
- Who ever has the nut in their hands when the timer is over will lose a point.
- Have 5 points each to start with.
